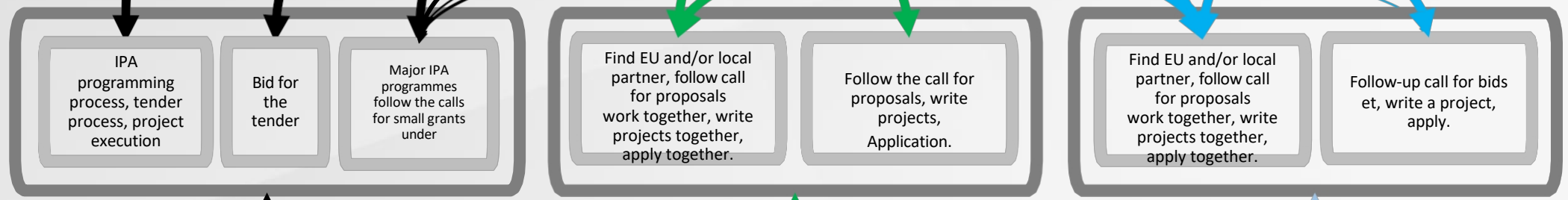

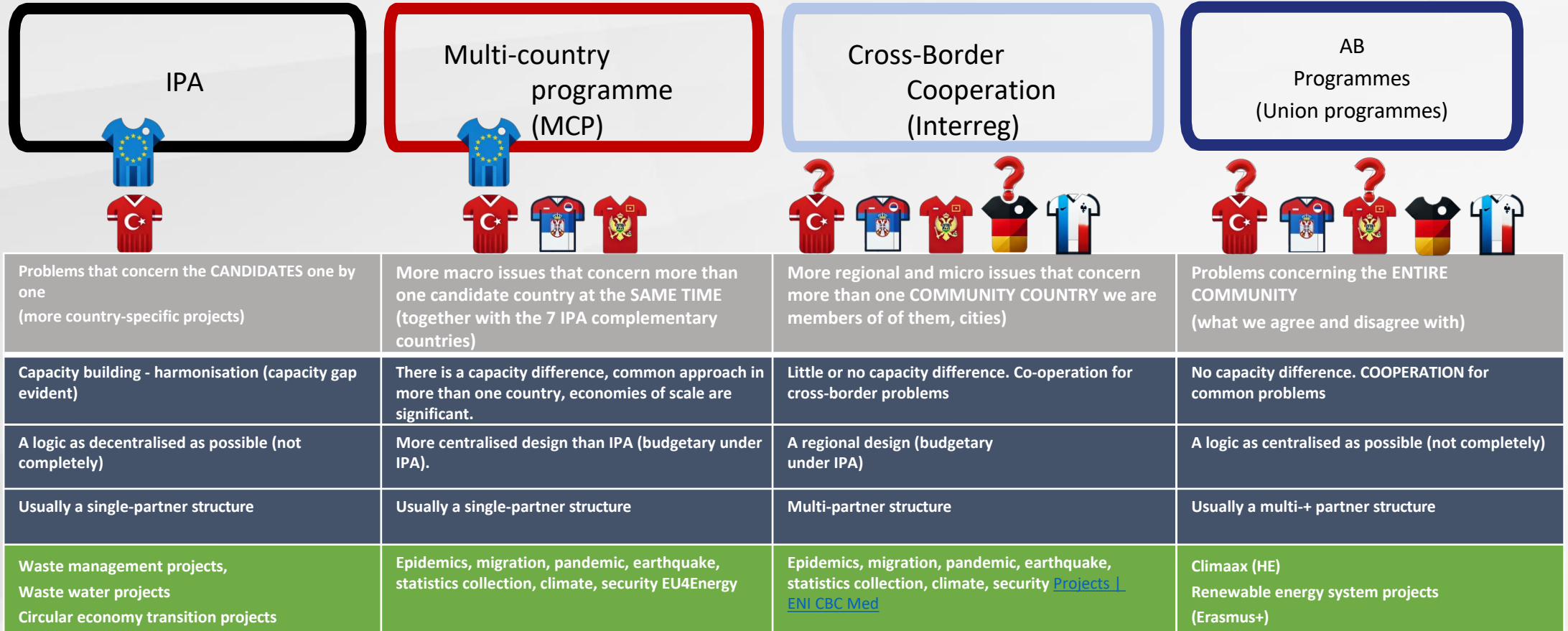

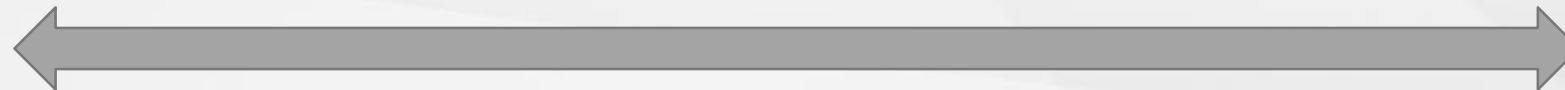

The programme seems clear, what should I do next?



Programme set at basic level.

Next question:

What are the sub-programmes? there be more specific programmes?

*There can always be a more direct appeal to the subject and organisation concerned.
Try to see the overall possibilities and look for the specific call before proceeding!*

Are suitable programmes open to Turkey? Is there funding available? there a call for proposals?

Turkey may not participate in every programme, even if it participated for a period of time, in the relevant year the programming may have just finished, the call may have just closed, you may be outside the CPA ...

the specific criteria for the programme met?

The call may have very specific criteria. For example; a certain legal status - accreditation requirement, a certain number of partner countries, a certain number of educational institutions, a certain organisational size (such as number of members or capital), a certain amount of project experience may be required...

Relevant grant guidelines - have the basic documents been read?

Grant guidelines can be long, complicated and boring. First read the introduction, the general criteria and the section on the specific call. Read the framework documents. Then question the specific criteria, if you meet them, start writing a project.

2. Recognise systems and read manuals



- It will take time to discover! It's not perfect!
- Can vary a lot from year to year and according to programme
- Mixed, scattered - can be eclectic
(modules may have been designed by different groups)
- Explanations may be insufficient (KPI)
- May be repetitive (budget)
- May be self-contradictory (budget document)
- May contradict the guidance (requested document)
- Guidance may be contradictory (not produced at the same time)
- SSS is inadequate
- Help may not be available
- Accumulations may occur
- Warnings may appear at the last moment!

"There is a limit of 120 pages.

The supporting document is not included in the page limit.
